However, with other activities eating in to the "part time" nature of the EDO position there has been, and continues to be some old information displayed. Please accept my apologies if bowlers are inconvenienced by this.

This was not, by any means, caused by the Webmaster, Rob Slaughter. I register appreciation to Rob for his understanding of my sometimes lack of computer savvy and website knowledge in conveying my requirements to the finished site. Thanks Rob.

### Bowler Registration

The TBAL Board publish the nominated value of sports registration affiliation with the NSO for each succeeding year at the end of the preceding year, as well as the desired method of handling of money and the distribution and issuing of registration cards.

For 2007, the Board agreed cards should be distributed to and reconciled by centre associations through the TBA State Manager or direct to TBAL. The TBA registration was \$11 with approval for the addition of a State and Centre Association administration fee. The TBAWA Management Committee passed a motion at its meeting on 8 December 2006 that the Registration for 2007 would be \$16, made up of TBAL \$11, Centre Association \$4 and TBAWA \$1. This was broadcast to all Centres.

With the exception of Melville and Warwick all Centres acted through TBAL State manager and charged \$16. The proprietor of Melville and Warwick directed the Centre Associations go direct through BAL and collect \$15, made up of TBAL \$11 and Centre Association \$4. At the end of the year both associations made a \$0.50 per bowler payment to TBAWA.

### **TBAWA Constitution**

During the year advice of a review of the TBAWA Constitution, notwithstanding acceptance by the WA Government Department of Consumer & Employment Protection (DOCEP) in 2006, required amendments to conform to the Associations Incorporation Act.

Prior verbal consultation with DOCEP resulted in acceptance of the proposed changes relating to the availability of records. These are to be dealt with under a Motion at the AGM.

### **Calendar Meeting**

I express my thanks to the few Centre Managers who attended the calendar meeting on 5 December 07. Notification of 2008 events was also received electronically from the organisers of ATBSO, AMF Junior Cup, Allstar Reserves, Sports Series and Junior Allstars.

Both the TBAWA State events and the calendar showing every notified event in WA appears on the TBAWA website. The calendar also appears on the TBAL website.

### **Education and Training**

Several courses were held during the year to assist with the advancement of the sport of tenpin bowling.

Several Junior Coaching Clinics were ably organised by Eileen Petersen and Bev Pendreigh at various centres. As well as coaching some State Teams, Ken Thompson has partnered me in presenting a State Team Manager Course and a Basic Beginners Bowling Proficiency Course in September and July respectively.

Plans for 2008 are well advanced to conduct more of those courses mentioned above and a Level 1 Coaching Course. Please contact your CVD or direct to TBAWA for more information.

### **Department of Sport and Recreation**

The consultant at DSR for Tenpin bowling during 2007 was Trevor Howard, who assisted with the requirements of the Sports Sustainability Program and Sports Lotteries Account Funding 2005-08.

In order to comply, TBAWA made periodic updates to the Annual Key Results Schedule (AKRS). The Association also submitted the necessary acquittal documents to confirm competent use of funding, acknowledgement of source of funds and census of participants and officials. Treasurer, Bev, provided copies of the audited financials.

Close liaison is maintained with Trevor, who was also instrumental in making sure all steps were followed to ensure eligibility for the Organisational Sustainability Program 2008/09 to 1010/11. A copy of the TBAWA Strategic Plan 2008-2010 to show the future aims was provided to assist with the grant.

TBAWA records thanks for the alliance with, and support of DSR and Lotterywest.

### **Coaches**

Without coaches the achievements of participants of tenpin bowling in WA would not improve. From new coaches to the highest level, all these people give bowlers the skills to move on to their next goal. The influence of a coach spreads to more than just the person directly being instructed, by virtue of the learner passing on to others some advice. In turn, they may become the next elite performer or next new coach.

My thanks and appreciation goes to all coaches in all centres.

### **Bowlers**

Tenpin bowling is a relaxing and at the same time, frustrating sport. Thank you for your participation and may you have many more years of enjoyment to come.

## Treasurer's Report

Some of the Government Grant has been spent, as shown on the Funds & Distributions sheet. It is hoped that qualified presenters will be available to conduct the courses we would like to put on for bowlers in the first half of 2008.

Ray Wright, as President, has been committed to ensuring stability and cooperation with one another in our Association. Distance and weekend family commitments meant that he could not attend many State tournaments, but he was always available for meetings and to me for guidance and advice. Thanks Ray.

Tom Lyon as Executive and Development Officer has continued to commit hours of his time to ensure that the day to day running of our Association becomes more efficient and that all the necessary paperwork is completed on time. He has also been acting Secretary for some months, as well as planning and organizing the training courses which we are now required to hold. His knowledge, skill and time are certainly very much appreciated by those of us who realize what an efficient and excellent job he has done. Thanks Tom.

The four State Teams, who travelled to National Tournaments, had varied success. These bowlers were required to attend regular coaching sessions, as well as pay for the honour of representing their state. Unfortunately, because we live in WA, the cost of air travel means that our State Team members are often required to pay much more than bowlers from other States. This may mean that there may be some bowlers who would like to be part of one of these Teams, but don't enter because of the cost. Maybe this is something that Centre Associations could discuss and contribute to in the future. As well as individual efforts, the success of these Teams is due in no small way to all the time the Team Officials put in on a voluntary basis.

Sally Watson as Manager spent countless hours on planning and working to ensure everything ran smoothly. I worked closely with her on the Rachuig, Youth and President Shield Teams, with both of us making sure bookings were made as early as possible and that the bills were paid on time.

The National Senior Team had their inaugural National Tournament in 2007, and those who competed thoroughly enjoyed the experience. I'm sure we'll have many more bowlers trying to be part of the next Team. The Teams for this consist of four bowlers, so is somewhat easier to organise than a team of seven. We didn't have any applications for Manager of this Team, so Brenda Kirkwood kindly volunteered to take on these duties prior to departure and, for a first-time Manager, as well as a bowler, did a great job.

On behalf of all State Team members I sincerely thank both Sally and Brenda for a job very efficiently done.

Coaching a State Team also means a big commitment of time, effort and money, so thank you also to Ken Thompson (and Glad) for the work with the Youth, President Shield and Rachuig Teams.

Junior bowlers are the future of our sport and many Centres have Junior Development squads, which are in the committed hands of volunteer parents and, hopefully, at least a Level 1 coach. Many of them also bowl Junior All-Stars, which gives them a different challenge each time. As they grow, in confidence, many of them are now entering the State Junior Open and Restricted Masters, and the State Championships, which is very encouraging. Thank you to all the Parents and Junior Development Officers, and to the Centre Managers who support them.

The TBAWA website is running very efficiently, thanks to webmaster, Rob Slaughter. Entry forms for all State Tournaments and State Team trials are available there for bowlers to download if they are not available in the home centres. For wider interest the E & DO also has the results of all State events posted, so please have a look at this site regularly.

I would encourage all bowlers to ensure they fully read all entry forms to ensure they are correctly completed before submitting them. This enables us to plan Tournaments more efficiently. I also thank all the Centre Managers for their cooperation and assistance when they are hosting a State event.

The BAS have been completed and submitted on time, and the financial records have been audited. A copy of the accounts for 2007 is attached.

Finally, I must officially thank my husband, Bill, for not usually complaining about the reams of paperwork stored at home, or the hours I spend completing it, or attending State events and meetings. As he says, this office never closes. My family commitments must sometimes take priority, but I take



great satisfaction in continuing to learn, and in completing all my tasks correctly. I hope to continue to do so in the future.


The audit opinion expressed in this report has been formed on the above basis.

## **Coaches and Managers Reports Received**

### **Coach Report, Youth, Jan 2007, Werribee Vic**

This years youth team when selected looked good and training went well.

In the girl's team Sylvia Wilson and Jess Barrett never missed training also bowling in two or three leagues a week; Stacey Ensell and Jessica Wilkey were a bit more part time and as time went on I thought they might struggle, especially when we had to bowl three days straight.

On the other hand the boys, Chris Barratt, Mitch Marris, Chris Watson and Michael Wilkey were at a tournament in the east, and then they worked well and looked good.

When we arrived, I checked what patterns were to be used and to my surprise, two days from the tournament starting, they changed the short oil pattern. They actually shortened it by another two feet. So that almost took three of our girls out of play because of ball speed issues.

The condition was that jumpy and everyone had problems.

Once again we met the problems about lane conditions in league play and our selection trials. None of our players had played on the short pattern before and only the boys and Sylvia in the girls had played on the long pattern.

I would like for all our trials to be bowled on some sort of challenging condition, so when we go to these national tournaments we have some idea. And to say good bowlers should be able to adjust is rubbish. All good coaches know if you don't practice then you won't be good at anything. If we put down a tough condition to select our teams like other states do, then the teams would at least know what to expect.

I would also like a letter sent to TBA Chairperson protesting the late change of the short oil pattern. What person in his right mind changes an oil pattern two days out when everybody has already set up their gear to what was advertised?

I would like to thank Kim Fragall for all her work as Manager, and the teams for how well they conducted themselves on and off the lanes.

I would also like to thank my wife, Glad, for her ongoing support and all the fundraising.

Lastly I would like to thank State Association for the opportunity to coach at this level.

Once in Melbourne we collect the two 12 seater buses and trailer and headed to Altona to drop off all bowling gear and then onto our accommodation at Amawind Apartments in Williamstown (ten minute drive from the bowl).

The accommodation was organised with 2 apartments for the men, two for the women with Ken, Bonita & Michael Muir and me in a three bedroom apartment. We were centrally located to various eating establishments, supermarkets etc.

The women suffered with illness and injury for the whole week. It is OK to say that most hire cars are supplied with road maps but these are hard to read if you have no local knowledge of the city and the road directories are not always up to date. It would also be useful for finding our way from airports to accommodation in some cities. I'm not sure if this sort of cost would be covered by the Govt. Grant money we receive.

I enjoyed my role as Manager for the men and women's teams this year although it was a bit trying at times. I would like to thank the State Committee for appointing me Manager and I look forward to applying for a position as Manager for the 2008 Rachuig Team.


There needs to be a little tightening of rules for the team while we are away.

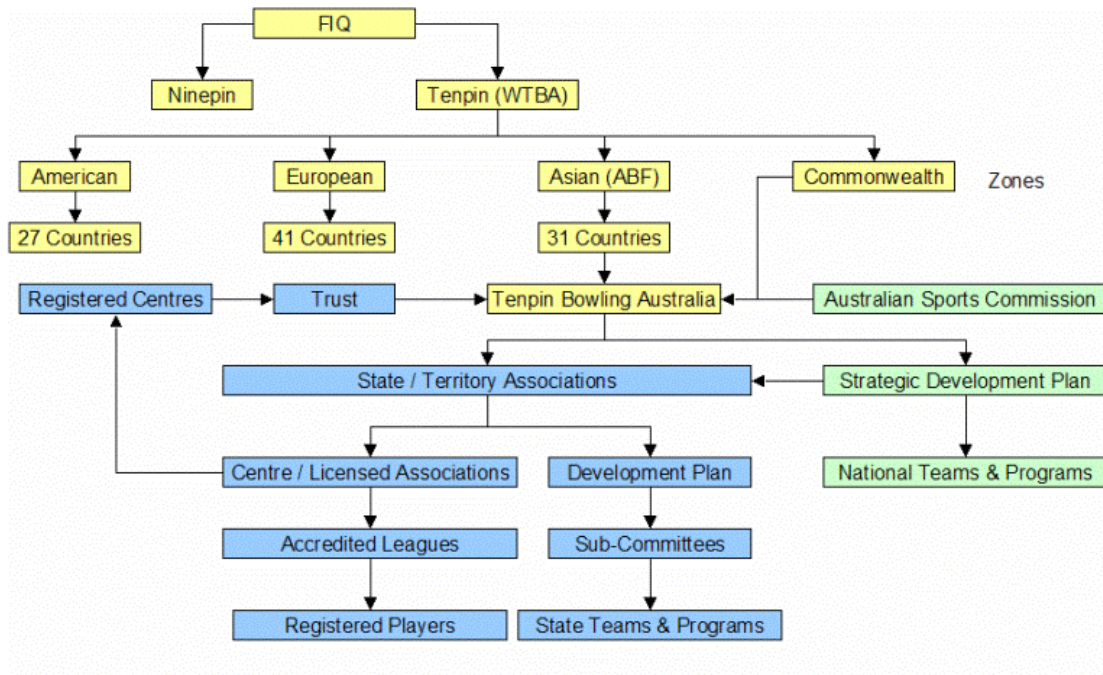
