RULES & CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

QUALIFYING

1. Qualifying is open to all Junior Bowlers who has **not reached the age of 18 as at 1 January 2009**, and is a resident of WA.
2. A valid signed receipt for an application for a 2009 TBAL Registered Player Membership Card to be produced and shown at Qualifying and Finals check in.
3. Qualifying (except for Defending Champion) held in all TBAL Accredited Bowling Centres in WA.
4. To qualify, each entrant will play a three (3) games series, SCRATCH scores to count. League games are permissible. Multiple entries are allowed with separate form and qualifying fee for each entry.
5. Pacers or League team members are allowed to bowl with the qualifier who must not bowl alone.
6. Highest qualifiers plus defending champion (at own expense and if still eligible) will make up a maximum field of 12 in Male and Female divisions for the finals.
7. If a tie occurs for the last position in the finals qualifying, a one (1) game roll-off will be played.

FINALS

- 8 The final will be 6-games proceeding to Top 4 (3-game series) playoff, in each division.
- 9 Any of the 12 Finalists failing to report by the Check-in time will be replaced by the next available reserve.
- 10 Finalist's names posted Wed 18 Feb, before the final at Kelmscott. Finalists advised by phone and/or email, where possible.
- 11 **It is the ultimate responsibility of each entrant to provide a current phone number and/or email for contact and to check with the Centre or the Tournament Director to see if they have qualified.**
- 12 **Dress Code:** Dress Trousers/Dress Shorts for Males. Skirts, Dress Shorts, Slacks or ¾ Pants for Females. A collared Bowling shirt is required, preferably with the bowlers name on. Shirts with another bowlers name on not allowed. No Track pants, cargo pants or Denim allowed.
DRESS CODE STRICTLY ENFORCED.

FINALS FORMAT

Phase 1 – 6-games. Highest 4 scratch totals proceed to Phase 2. Pinfall carried forward

Phase 2 – Top 4 will bowl a series of three (3) games.

Highest score in each division after Phase 2 is the **2009 WA Junior Open Masters Champion** and will be eligible to represent WA in the TBAL 2009 Junior Masters, Newcastle NSW on Sat 11 April 09

PRIZE FUND – 1st Place (Payable on confirmation of participation in Australian Junior Masters in Newcastle)

- Paid entry into Australian Junior Masters
- 100% of available prize money
- WA Junior Open Masters Shirt and Chevron

If the winner decides not to compete in Australian Junior Masters at Newcastle, the prize payout is:

Up to 12 entries: 1st Place – 60% of available prize money, Masters Shirt and Chevron, 2nd Place 40%

13 to 17 entries: 1st Place – 42% , Masters Shirt and Chevron, 2nd Place 33%, 3rd Place 25%
